LEADERSHIP ACADEMY FOR BUILDING REPRESENTATIVES

The Texas AFT Leadership Academy equips and empowers members to become strong leaders. Current and new building representatives are encouraged to take Leadership Academy courses and learn how to build power for positive change.

Those who attend the three sessions and complete the required coursework will be certified as Texas AFT building representatives. Graduates will receive a certificate, a special gift, and our thanks for building a strong union at a final celebration event.

COURSE 1

Power, Leadership, and the Responsibilities of the Representative

• Learn about the essential components of a strong union, and explore your own leadership qualities as you prepare to take on the role as a campus or worksite representative

COURSE 2

Communication, Motivation, and Building the Union

• Learn how to analyze your school and practice reaching out to new employees and other prospective members through effective communication.

COURSE 3

Standing Up For—and With—Your Members

 Building power includes building a relationship with your supervisor or principal. Learn about some basic rights important to you and your members, then practice preparing for and holding a meeting with your boss to solve workplace issues.

EXPECTATIONS OF PARTICIPANTS

Campus Representatives and key union leaders are highly encouraged to attend and become certified Texas AFT building representatives. Participants are required to attend all three (3) courses and complete course assignments to become certified. Meals and training costs are provided by Texas AFT.

EXPECTATION OF THE LOCAL

The objective the Texas AFT Leadership Academy is to build our union's capacity. We do this by first training up our campus leaders. Second, we identify new trainers.

Participating locals are expected to (1) organize a class of at least 10 leaders minimum, (2) identify at least two (2) leaders to become co-trainers and learn how to teach the curriculum, and (3) share any outside costs associated with the program (i.e. photo copies, organizing materials for leaders, etc.).
