Returning to campus now, with cases as seriously untreatable as they are, is an irresponsible decision. Sadly, my loyalty and politeness will take over and I'll say yes, I'll return if you need me. I'll mean it. But I'm also working on my will for the first time in my life. Because returning to work could mean I die and have to make arrangements for my children. I have school age children. Fortunately, they have a good, safe home environment and I can ensure they're continuing their studies. I know that is not the case for all students. I would still prefer a dumb child to a dead one. Statistics show that kids don't get sick as adults do. But we don't know the long term effects of the illness. I'm not willing to sacrifice my children for what I feel is a funding issue. Too many administrators don't have the strength to stand up for what is right because they're fighting for a salary they need.
